
Allotments: Extremely valuable – grossly underestimated – shockingly unknown

More subjects will follow.




There is an amazing amount of knowledge with allotment gardeners. One of the surprising outcomes of a study in the UK- focussing on professional farmers and to allotment gardeners- was that the total knowledge about food production from plants of allotment gardeners by far exceeded that of professional farmers. Afterwards this is easy to explain because most professional farmers are specialised in only one to three crops and allotment gardeners do "everything". But there is much more:



In an allotment in Leipzig (Germany) named after Karl Förster - the gardeners have made and maintain together a long walking road through the allotment where all over the year at least some plants have flowers.



It is easy to understand how much knowledge they need to have and how determined they must be to keep it alive.




Many associations and federations of allotment gardens put an enormous effort in nature education – here an information picture about butterflies.
